Homework Policy

Aims of homework

- To create a link between school and home and encourage parents to become partners in the educational process.
- to reinforce work done in class
- to revise
- to extend classwork
- to assess the child's understanding or progress
- to develop good working habits
- to develop the child's ability to work independently

Who? For all classes

When? All pupils are given homework from Monday to Thursday generally. Homework will not normally be given at weekends but may be from time to time at the class teacher's discretion. Homework will not be given on nights when the children will participate in school activities e.g. school concerts etc. In recognition of visits to the school and of special occasions such as a match victory, production of drama etc, no homework will be given if all members of a class are involved and only oral homework will be given if some members of the class are involved.

Subject matter:, Mixture including:

- learning i.e. tables, spellings, poetry, songs,
- reading i.e. formal/pleasure/Caper
- writing i.e. practice/ different writing genre/ writing process
- maths
- research for project
- study

Nai Shoisir: colouring, reading, maths, writing Time: 10 mins

Nai Shínsír – reading, spelling, maths, handwriting skills, writing Time: 20 mins

Rang 1/2 - English and Irish reading, English and Irish spellings, maths, tables, writing, handwriting skills, nature study, poetry, music. Time 30 mins

Rang 3/4 : Irish and English reading, Irish and English spelling, Irish and English writing, Irish and English poetry, tables, maths, nature study, history, geography, science, music, research project Time. 50 mins

Rang 5/6: Irish and English reading, Irish and English spelling, Irish and English writing, Irish and English poetry, tables, maths, nature study, history, geography, science, music, research project Time: 1 hour

Guidelines for Parents and Guardians:

Homework forms a positive link between home and school.

Parents or guardians can give valuable support to the work of the school and help the child greatly by showing a positive interest in and encouragement of homework.

Parents or guardians should take the responsibility to ensure that children complete the home work outlined.

It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child's homework is done to the best of the child's ability.

It is not the responsibility of the school to ensure that homework is done. This is ultimately the parents responsibility.

Some useful tips:

- 1) having a set time each day for homework
- 2) providing a specific quiet place conducive to work and free from distractions i.e. television, music, other children playing, food,
- 3) Supervising the homework: helping the child to understand the assignment necessary but never actually doing the work for the child
- 4) Listening to formal reading, spellings, tables, poetry,
- 5) Checking that homework has been completed and always signing the pupil's homework notebook

Only written excuses from parents/guardians will be accepted from children who have not completed their homework.

- the class teacher will inform the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the child by a note in the homework journal if any aspect of the child's homework has not been completed.

The teacher should always be informed if any child has a problem with a particular aspect of the homework.

An appointment should be made to meet the class teacher if it frequently takes the child considerably longer than is recommended to complete the homework or if the child has persistent difficulties with an aspect of the homework.
